- just need a different style of support








Our Offer...

Engagement with parents / commissioners...



We produce reports on a half termly basis to update parents and commissioners on progress and learning.

We aim to attend annual reviews wherever possible, as well as any other relevant meetings.

Parents and commissioners are welcome to attend or observe sessions if required and appropriate.







Case Study

• R (12 years old) has been out of school for 1 year due to anxiety stemming from a diagnosis of ASD and PDA, and has been unable to manage group social or learning situations. R presents as a selective mute with a history of self harming and eating disorders.



- R started with 1 hour sessions with her mother present and 9 months later, comes for 2 sessions of 5 hours each on her own.
- R previously refused to write in front of adults. R is currently completing a level 1 qualification with OCN in Confidence Caring for Animals which involves her writing independently, annotating pictures, completing worksheets and putting together a portfolio of evidence.
- R takes part in horse agility competitions online where she has to submit videos of her participation with a pony. She has been fully involved with setting up her account, developing her profile page and practicing the courses before deciding which video to submit.
- R now tolerates other learners on site at the same time, occasionally interacts with others by signing and eats and drinks on site. She has also generalised her improved social skills and was recently able to spend a week away with her grandparents for the first time, without her mother.
